From the Executive Director

Dear Friend,

It's hard for me to look back on 2024.

It is the year one of the most devastating pedestrian tragedies in our city's history happened: West Portal.

It was also the ten-year anniversary of World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims. With the help of volunteers, we painted a pair of shoes white in memory of every person who has died in a traffic crash since 2014. There were 317 pairs of shoes on the steps of City Hall.

As gut-wrenching as many days and weeks were last year, I am so glad that Walk SF was here. To show up for victims and to stand up for change, again and again.



We can do this because of you. You see what's happening on our streets – and are doing something about it. Your generosity powers the policy work, advocacy, and organizing needed to make San Francisco lead the nation as a truly safe, pedestrian-first city.

This work has never been more urgent. People walking in our city face more threats than ever, from supersized vehicles to rampant dangerous driving. 2024 was the deadliest year for pedestrians in San Francisco since 2007.

But because of supporters like you, Walk SF continues to rise to the challenge in more ways than ever. And we must. Our lives depend on it, as do our communities and climate.

So with your support, Walk SF will keep standing up for change, again and again. We'll push for all the commonsense solutions needed at intersections so we can cross safely. We'll push for the City to design and enforce streets that keep drivers at safe speeds. We'll keep championing bold state bills while continuing to demand our City leaders lead on traffic safety.

Ten Years of World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims

Solidarity, Support, and Sending a Message



When Walk SF started working with the loved ones of crash victims to start a Bay Area chapter of Families for Safe Streets, one of the first things we did together was to host World Day of Remembrance for Road Traffic Victims in 2014.

This event, held outside of San Francisco's City Hall, is so important: to be together in solidarity, to remember those hurt and killed, and to shine needed light on what's happening.

Because 2024 was the ten-year anniversary of the event and the City's commitment to Vision Zero – a proactive, data-driven approach to end severe and fatal crashes – we felt it was crucial to do more to build awareness and send a message about the toll of dangerous streets.

In the week leading up to the event and thanks to dozens of volunteers, we hung 317 memorial signs at every intersection where someone had been killed in a traffic crash in the past decade. This meant that for a few days, it was hard to go anywhere in the city without seeing one of these signs. That was exactly the point. No corner of San Francisco is untouched by traffic violence.

We also painted 317 shoes white for the temporary memorial on the steps of City Hall. We worked with Families for Safe Streets members to get their stories in an unprecedented number of media outlets, including *KQED Perspectives*, the *Sing Tao Daily*, and the *San Francisco Chronicle*. And we kept coming back to the need for City leaders to refocus on Vision Zero.

You're How Walk SF Can Push for Change Every Day, in Every Way

Fighting for Safe Intersections



It's important to celebrate progress, too. We especially love to see more intersections with pedestrian safety zones and turn calming.

As of 2023, 900 intersections on the 'high-injury network' – the most dangerous streets in San Francisco – still had received no safety improvements. When the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) committed to bring baseline pedestrian safety fixes to these 900 intersections by the end of 2024, Walk SF went into serious watchdog mode.

This meant everything from asking for progress updates at public meetings to sharing our appreciation with the SFMTA crews doing the work. The SFMTA completed 74% of intersections by the end of 2024, so our watchdogging continues.

Supporting the City's Next Promenade

For decades, having vehicle traffic on the Upper Great Highway has meant that pedestrians can only walk on the narrow, hilly path next to traffic – not next to the beach. The beach itself isn't an option to walk on for anyone with a stroller, wheelchair, or mobility limitations.

But on November 5, 2024, voters said YES to making permanent – and 7 days a week – a two mile stretch of car-free space on the Upper Great Highway. This means San Francisco is getting a new oceanside park and promenade, and the largest pedestrianization project in California history!

Walk SF was proud to be a partner on this visionary campaign led by Friends of Ocean Beach Park. Like JFK Promenade, this is another big step toward a San Francisco that truly prioritizes safety, people, joy, and connection on our streets. Again, we see that the majority of San Franciscans are behind us. We will continue to build on this.

Putting Vision Zero in Focus for City Leaders



2024 marked the ten-year anniversary of San Francisco adopting Vision Zero, a commitment and proactive approach to end severe and fatal traffic crashes. A decade ago, Walk SF led the campaign for the City to make this commitment; San Francisco was the third city in the United States to do so.

While the City has since embraced a more data-driven approach plus completed important safety projects, severe and fatal crashes have yet to come down. But this isn't a failure of Vision Zero. It's the failure of our City to implement solutions at the scale needed to succeed. That's why in 2024, Walk SF:

- Researched Vision Zero cities around the world and analyzed San Francisco's past efforts
- Brought together the 35+ community-based organizations, nonprofits, and civic groups in the Vision Zero Coalition to develop shared recommendations we sent to all City leaders
- Got dozens of media stories on Vision Zero, talking about the ways San Francisco can accelerate progress
- Showed up at every relevant commission and agency to ask them to refocus on Vision Zero

What San Francisco's approach to Vision Zero will be moving forward is still unclear. With the support of our members, Walk SF will not stop pushing our leaders to make Vision Zero the success story it can and must be.

New Law Will Help Address Some of the Deadliest Streets

SB 960, which Walk SF sponsored in 2024, was signed into law by Governor Newsom. SB 960 puts greater accountability in place for roads overseen by Caltrans to be designed for the safety of people outside the vehicle. Some of San Francisco's deadliest streets are under Caltrans' control, like Lombard Street. We held a press conference with Senator Wiener for SB 960 on Lombard, where two pedestrians had died within two weeks in 2024.



Addressing Dangerous Speeding from Every Angle

A First-Ever Bill Gets to the Governor's Desk



Sponsoring SB 961 was part of our ongoing #SlowOurStreets campaign, which we launched in 2020 with the support of our members.

Year after year, speeding is the #1 cause of severe and fatal traffic crashes in San Francisco. That's also true statewide, with more than 1,000 Californians killed in speeding-related traffic crashes every year. With vehicles bigger and heavier than ever, the stakes are even higher if a crash happens – especially for those outside the vehicle. Meanwhile, many cars and trucks can now reach very high speeds within seconds.

In 2024, Walk SF was proud to sponsor State Senator Scott Wiener's Senate Bill 961, which would have required all cars and trucks manufactured or sold in

California (except emergency vehicles and motorcycles) to give an audio and visual alert to drivers when they're going more than 10 MPH above the speed limit, starting in 2030. This safety technology, called 'passive Intelligent Speed Assistance,' is now required in all new European vehicles.

Because of Walk SF supporters, we were able to go all-in on the campaign to make SB 961 law – and our efforts got this bold bill farther than we could have imagined.

Over the course of several months, Walk SF worked with Families for Safe Streets to bring the personal stories of victims directly to state legislators in Sacramento. Our executive director Jodie Medeiros and Families for Safe Streets member Joe Martinez gave powerful expert testimonies at key hearings at the State Capitol. We helped garner 5,000+ emails, hundreds of phone calls, widespread media coverage, and endorsements of the bill from the nation's safety experts.



We went to Sacramento with Families for Safe Streets members to bring their stories about the toll of dangerous speeding directly to legislators.

The California State Assembly voted 42-12 and the California State Senate voted 26-9 to pass SB 961. This was remarkable considering this was the first bill of its kind to be introduced in the California legislature.

Unfortunately, Governor Newsom ultimately stood with the auto industry instead of with victims - and vetoed the bill in September. This was incredibly disappointing considering how far we had come and the lifesaving potential of Intelligent Speed Assistance.

Given it took eight years to pass state legislation allowing speed cameras to be piloted in California, we know that an Intelligent Speed Assistance bill could take multiple attempts. With the support of our members, we will continue pushing for lifesaving anti-speeding technology in vehicles – and other bills that can move the needle in preventing severe and fatal crashes.

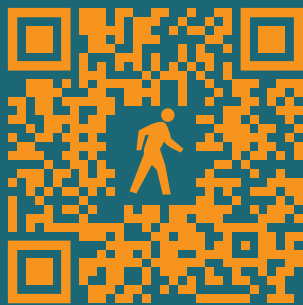
